



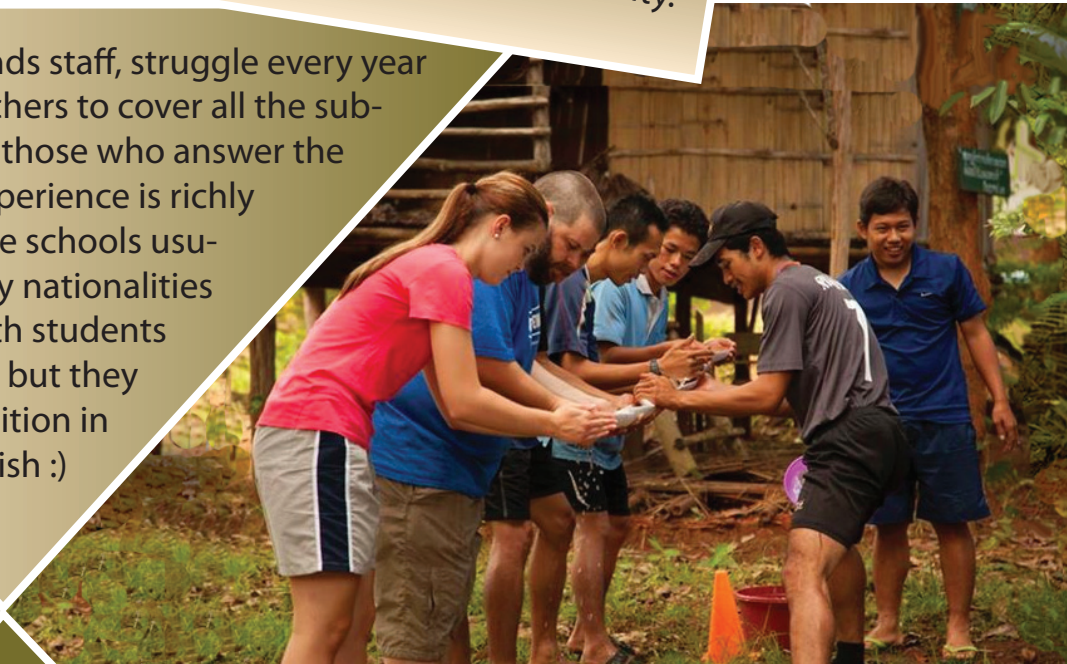

A selection of the schools

NEPAL, Kathmandu International Study Centre — www.kisc.edu.np.

Has both Cambridge (UK) and MSA (American) accreditation. More than 200 students from K to Year-13. For urgent staffing needs financial packages are available. There are Kiwi staff at the school.

ETHIOPIA, Bingham Academy — www.binghamacademy.net.

Founded in 1946, the school continues to develop and grow. As well as mission partners' children, students are from business, NGO and embassy families. Cambridge International curriculum. There are Kiwi staff at the school.

CAMBODIA, Hope International School — www.hope.edu.kh. Two campuses, in

Pnom Penh & Siem Reap (near Angkor Wat). This school has both Cambridge and IB (International Baccalaureate) accreditation. Preference is for a minimum two-year contract. There are Kiwi staff at the school.

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What they have in common:

Most of these schools require teachers to raise financial support at home, but offer a variety of staff benefits (see their websites for these). The school year starts in August and staff normally go for at least a year. Teaching is in English. They are all Christian schools and are typically governed by a board which represents several different missions.

As well as mission families, children of locals and secular expatriates also go to the schools; being a teacher brings many opportunities to share and model the Gospel to those who don't know Christ.

NIGER, Sahel Academy —

Located in Niamey, Sahel's mission is to develop students through a high-quality, holistic education while nurturing a Christlike character and a heart of service. The 180 students come from all over the world. Teachers are needed at various levels of this K-to-Year-12 school. There are Kiwi staff at the school.

There is also an opportunity to teach a small class of children at Galmi Hospital (www.galmi.org) - special needs & ESL teaching experience required.
